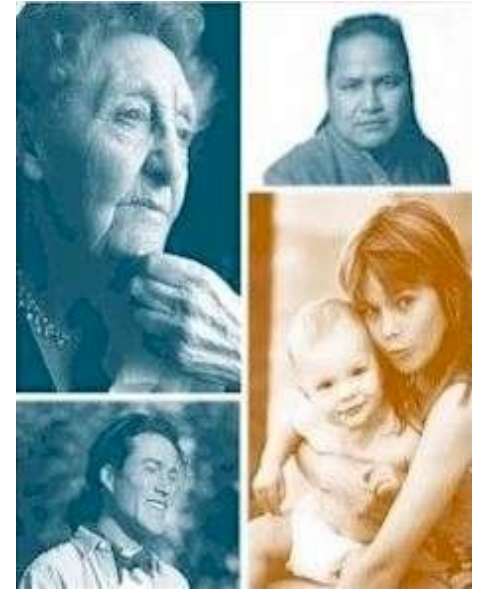

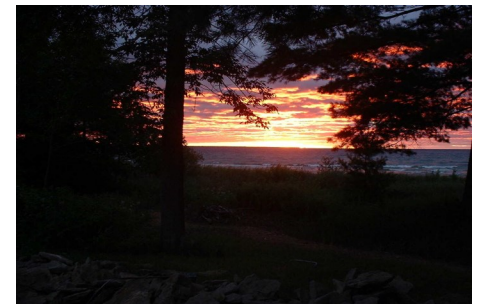

Access to Care

If you believe you may need mental health services, you may call the Access Center (989 356-2161) during business hours (M-F, 8-5). Professional staff will briefly discuss your concerns with you and, if necessary, assist you in scheduling additional service.

If you believe you are experiencing a mental health emergency, you may call anytime, any day, for immediate care. Call:

"Person-Centered Plans"

Any on-going treatment or service you may require will be based upon your individual needs as they are determined by a "person-centered plan." These plans are developed with your full participation and agreement, and will focus on outcomes you want to achieve. You may invite others (family members or others important to you) to be involved in the planning.

Services for Mental Illness, Emotional Disturbance, and Co-occurring Disorders

Northeast Michigan Community Mental Health Authority offers an array of services designed to help adults with serious mental illnesses, co-occurring disorders and children with serious emotional disturbances. A person's eligibility for certain services will depend upon needs established as a part of the person-centered planning process.

Services for Children:

- Assessment and Treatment/Referral
- Outpatient & Psychiatric (including Emergencies)
- Supports Coordination/Case Management
- Home-based Services
- Residential and Inpatient Services

Services for Adults:

- Assessment and Treatment/Referral
- Outpatient & Psychiatric, (including Emergencies)
- Supports Coordination/Case Management
- Psycho-Social Rehabilitation (Light of Hope Clubhouse)
- Assertive Community Treatment (ACT)
- Residential/Inpatient Services
- Geriatric/Nursing Home Services

Services for Developmental Disabilities

Northeast Michigan Community Mental Health Authority also offers an array of services to support people who have developmental disabilities. These services are designed to promote and support people to live and work as independently as possible in the community. A person's eligibility for certain services will depend upon needs established as a part of the person-centered planning process.

- Professional clinical services
- Supports Coordination/Case Management
- Community Support Services
- Community Employment Services
- Supported Independent Living
- Residential Services
- Family Support Subsidy Program

What Do Services Cost?

Under Michigan law, a person's or family's cost of service is limited by an "ability-to-pay" formula that assures that services provided by community mental health will be affordable. Private insurance you have may cover or reduce the cost of services. Northeast Michigan Community Mental Health Authority also accepts Medicaid as payment in full for covered services.
