This 6 continuing education credit in-person workshop will introduce attendees to a Culture of Gentleness and will provide the basics of providing positive supports through the important role of the helping professional. Foundational principles of developing and strengthening supportive relationships as a strategy to reduce challenges and build a foundation for growth and healing are explored. Emphasis is placed on elements that lead to others feeling safe and more valued, how one's trauma history can influence behavior, planning proactively to reduce stress, and the value of supporting all involved.

Target audience: Social Workers/Direct Care staff/Case Managers/Behavioral Health Professionals

Content level: beginner

About the instructor Janis Sahr is a licensed Special Education Teacher with an endorsement in Cognitive Impairments, K-8 teacher with emphasis in Language Arts and Social Studies. She started her career working for the Michigan Department of Health & Human Services in the Child Protection unit. Janis also worked privately for families in the Alpena area who needed care for their child with autism. This led Janis to go back for her Master's in Special Education. Janis worked for the AMA ESD for 13 years as a RTI Specialist and Special Education Teacher for students ages 5-26 with Moderate and Severe Impairments.

Janis has been working closely with Peggy Yaschasz who has 36 years of experience in the Behavioral Health System and was one of the first to implement Gentle Teaching at NEMCMH. Janis believes that by learning Gentle Teaching Techniques, all staff and community members will ensure individuals with disabilities will be as independent as they can be and live their best life as possible.

Who Should Attend: This in-person workshop is designed for Behavioral Health staff at all levels of experience and licensure to explore or gain a better working knowledge of Gentle Teaching.
